Definition

Intellectual property includes:

- 1. Computer software purchased or acquired for use by COM-FSM.
- COM-FSM owns the copyright to any works created by staff, administrators, student employees, and other non-faculty employees in the course of their College duties. This includes but not limited to research works, publications, digital images (original, scanned or digitized reproductions), audio, video, web pages, software, and compilation of data.

Use of copyrighted works

Materials available on the Web or in other electronic formats are considered intellectual property and are protected by international copyright law unless a disclaimer or waiver expressly states otherwise. Any COM-FSM employees contractual or otherwise may not copy or redistribute any materials owned by others, i.e. copyrighted works, without the expressed permission of the copyright owner, except under provision of fair academic use. Thus use of content from other sources in doing work for the college needs to include a Fair Use Disclaimer to prevent content from being accused of copyright infringement. Under the principle of fair use, copyrighted works can be used in certain circumstances without the permission of the copyright owner.
