ACCJC approved 24 programs to be offered, including the baccalaureate degree in Elementary Education.

On February 1, 2021, the AFT Instructors met with Mr. Mark Kostika, Chief of Agriculture for Pohnpei State. Additionally, AFT instructor Espiritu met with Adams Family farmer to discuss subject on the same day. In both meetings the discussions around internships and accommodating interns were received and approved. Afterwards the Instructors met with Micronesian Conservation Trust (MCT) and Cooperative Research and Extension (CRE) on the same subject matter. Again in both meetings the responses were supportive and favorable.

### International license for utilizing GSES® training curriculum

The Global Sustainable Energy Solutions Pty. Ltd. (GSES), Pacific Power Association (PPA), Deutsche Gesellschaft fur Internationale Zusammenarbeit GmbH (GIZ) and Adapting to Climate Change and Sustainable Energy program (EU-GIZ ACSE) have entered into a partnership to provide training and resources to institutions within the Pacific Islands

through Pacific Community (SPC). In March 2020, CTEC's two electrical Instructors and Pohnpei Utilities Corporation (PUC) technicians participated in an intense week long industry certification training on installation and troubleshooting of Ingrid Solar System.

The two CTEC electrical instructors were certified; hence making the college's CTEC becoming one of the few institutions eligible to use the curriculum from the training. As such, on February 23, 2021, an agreement was singed between Global Sustainable Energy Solutions Pty. Ltd. (GSES) and the college permitting CTEC electrical instructors to access and use GSES® curriculum in the Associates of Applied Science in Building Technology, Electrical program. This curriculum also prepares students for the European Union Pacific Technical and Vocational Education Training (EU PacTVET) Certification Levels 3 & 4 through SPC.

#### Special science seminar series

Dr. Nick Zoa, world-renowned seismologist and researcher, commenced with a series of special science seminars hosted by Kosrae Campus. Each seminar topic lasted about 45 minutes with a 15-minute session for Q & A. Some topics covered during this reporting period included Cosmology: Our Universe, Dark Matter, Dark Energy; Geology of Kosrae; and History of Mankind: How people finally came to Micronesia.

#### Land Grant and faculty building roofing project

Despite the drawbacks and countless obstacles encountered during these difficult times, TE Construction Company was able to finally complete the Land Grant and Faculty Building roofing project during this reporting period. On March 4, 2021, Director Francisco Mendiola, Mr. Alfred Olter, and Dean Mike held a zoom meeting with Mr. Swinston Siba, TE Construction Company representative to close-out the roofing project.

#### **Schoology Group to improve communications**

Yap Campus created a group for all employees who have access to Schoology this spring 2021. The Schoology Group is where to post announcements/updates and continue to keep in touch with students/staff/faculty. This has proven to be a great way to reach out to students to share and exchange information. Students have a higher rate of response compared to communicating with them via email.

#### **Tutoring services**

- 228 students enrolled at Yap Campus last fall 2020 semester.
  Of these 228 students, 227 registered for credits while one was just auditing a class.
- Of these 227 students, only 219 students completed the term (eight students completely withdrew the term).
- Of these 219 students, 162 (or 74%) earned semester GPA of >= 2.0; while, 57 (or 26%) with semester GPA of < 2.0.</li>
- Additionally, 186 (or 85%) of these 219 students completed the semester in good academic standing (CumGPA of >= 2.0); while 33 (or 15%), not in good academic standing (CumGPA < 2.0).</li>
- 143 students enrolled in the campus' tutoring program. Of these 143 students, 123 (or 86%) completed the semester in good academic standing; while 20 (or 14%), not in good academic standing.

#### **Dual enrollment for high school students**

Seven seniors from Chuuk High School are enrolled at Chuuk Campus under the college's dual enrollment program for high school students. Each is taking two courses: one in English Reading, and one in English Writing. Since they are still high school students, they are not eligible for Pell grant; as such, Chuuk State Department of Education is paying for their tuitions and fees.

#### First baccalaureate graduates

Six students from Chuuk Campus graduated the Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education program last fall 2020. The six graduates represented the first batch of students from the campus who graduated from college's baccalaureate program. This semester, three students from the campus are potential program completers from the BS in Elementary Education program.
