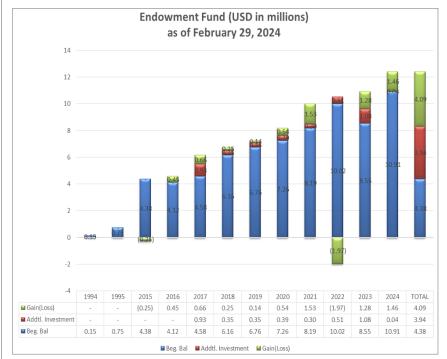

COLLEGE ENDOWMENT FUND SEES \$1.5M INCREASE: UNREALIZED MARKET GAINS AND NEW INVESTMENTS DRIVE 14% GROWTH

Since October 1, 2023, the endowment fund has seen a notable increase, rising by 14%, equivalent to \$1.5 million. This growth primarily stems from an unrealized market gain of \$1.46 million, coupled with an additional \$40,000 in investments.

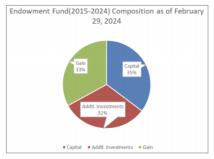


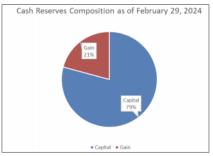
FINANCIAL GROWTH: CASH RESERVES AND INVESTMENTS **SURGE SINCE OCTOBER 2023**

The cash reserves fund experienced a 9% increase, totaling \$317K, credited to unrealized market gains since October 1, 2023. Furthermore, the overall investment portfolio soared by 13%, reaching \$1.81M. This surge was fueled by unrealized market gains of \$1.77M along with an additional investment infusion of \$40K since the aforementioned date.

Credit Card Transfer Progress. The credit card transfer from Joseph Habuchmai to Dr. Theresa Koroivulaono is still in progress. We have fulfilled all the necessary requirements with the Bank of Guam, and we are currently awaiting the final release of the transfer to us.

ATM Machine Installation. We have successfully secured the installation of an ATM machine at the National Campus through the Bank of Guam. The machine is expected to arrive from Guam soon. Once it arrives, it will be placed inside the back of the Library with an access door. It will be enclosed with air conditioning and equipped with 24/7 security cameras inside and outside, ensuring safety for both the college and the community.

Chuuk Campus Snack Canteen Operation. The Chuuk Campus Snack Canteen remains operational.

CTEC Blue Plate: Student Snack Arrangement. CTEC Blue Plate has devised a plan for student clubs holding yellow cards to prepare and serve food and snacks to students. Dean Silbanuz is collaborating with the fiscal officer to implement a similar arrangement to those at the National and Kosrae campuses, allowing students to open accounts at the campus bookstore for purchasing snacks or opting for takeout during lunch.

Support for Kosrae Campus. Director Mendiola, Project Manager Olter, and Ricky recently traveled to the Kosrae campus to provide support for ongoing work on the generator housing, rewiring, and hookups.

New Maintenance Carpenter Hire. In collaboration with the Dean of Kosrae Campus, the college has hired a new Maintenance Carpenter. This individual will work alongside the existing staff at the Kosrae campus to continue progress on the Veranda project.



Fabricated Container RFP Posting. The Fabricated Container Request for Proposal (RFP) has been successfully posted on the college website.

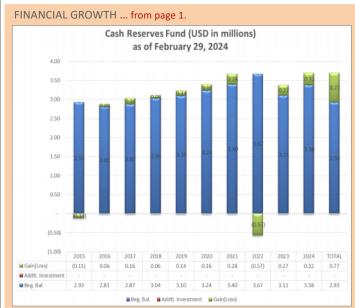
Denyo Generators for Chuuk and Pohnpei. Denyo Generators were procured for Chuuk on February 10, 2024, and for Pohnpei on February 19, 2024.

New Vans and Signage Installation. Three brand new vans have been received, and COM-FSM signage has been installed on all three vehicles. Two vans are allocated for instructional affairs at the National Campus, while one van is designated for CTEC.

COM-FSM Signage on National Campus Buses. National Campus buses have been installed with COM-FSM signage, with one bus remaining to undergo the installation

Upcoming Van Deliveries. Three brand new vans are currently on order for National, Yap, and Kosrae campuses. These vans are expected to arrive at each location soon. The van assigned to the National Campus will specifically serve Enrollment Management and Student Services.

Soil Purchase Request for RMI. The Republic of the Marshall Islands has requested the purchase of 50 cubic yards of soil for the baseball field. This procurement is intended to prepare for the upcoming Micro Games.





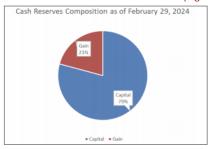
ENDOWMENT FUND | WEIGHTED ANNUAL RETURN

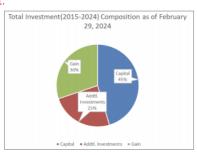

UPDATES FROM THE MAINTENANCE AND FACILITY OFFICE

VPAS and Director of Maintenance Participate in Infrastructure Workshop. On March 13, 2024, the Vice President for Administration and Services (VPAS) (VPAS) along with the Director of Maintenance & Facility participated in the Infrastructure Workshop held at the FSM Capital.

The primary objective of this workshop was to enhance the planning and execution of Infrastructure projects across the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM).

Key Points Discussed:

- FSM's Share of Compact Funding. The FSM's allocation of Compact funding constitutes 10% of the total \$140 million, amounting to \$14.0 million.
- Allocation Breakdown. Within this share, 35% (\$4.9 million) is designated for infrastructure projects, while the remaining 65% (\$9.1 million) is allocated for Health and Education Operations.



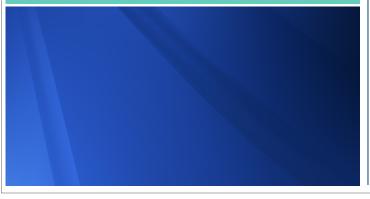
