The college received award notice from the U.S. Department of Education on May 05, 2020 and signed the Certification Agreement assuring the college will and has used 50% of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

The total amount of funds received from the U.S. Department of Education for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students as of this report is \$9,529,367.00. The total amount distributed to students as of September 30, 2021 is \$4, 289,209.83 with the most recent disbursement in the 4th quarter totaling \$648,895.83. 1,216 students were eligible for this grant funding and 1,200 received funding.

Eligibility for receiving grant funding was based on four criteria.

1. Registered for summer 2021 semester as a new, continuing or returning student
2. Eligible for Pell Grant funding
3. Did not completely withdraw prior to July 2, 2021

The amount each student received was based on the number of credits the student was registered for. The \$5,899,053.00 was divided into three disbursements – summer 2021, fall 2021, and spring 2022 based on % distribution of registered credits with \$648,895.83 being distributed to 1200 students.
